## Advantages

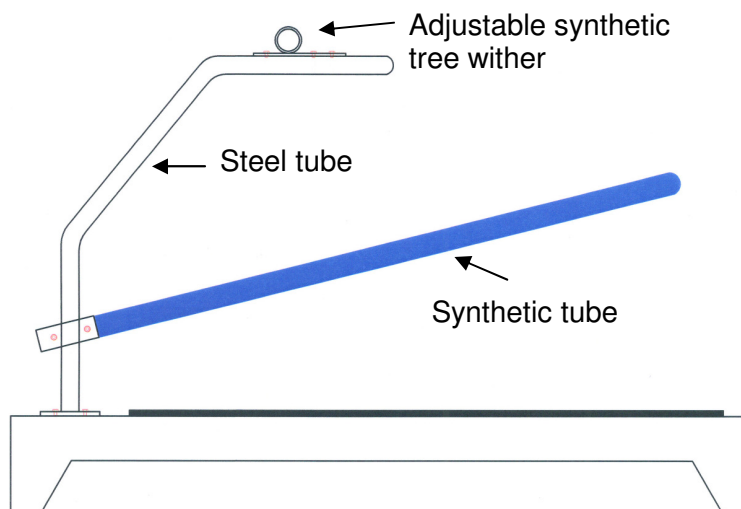
- ⇒ The Release cubicle is animalfriendly.

## Usage

The cubicle is created by an animal-friendly flexible tube of high quality synthetic material. The tube is connected to the standingpost in the front. The curved standingpost creates a strong overall. The adjustable tree wither is connected at the horizontal portion of the curved standingpost. Therefore the cow has the necessary optimal freedom.

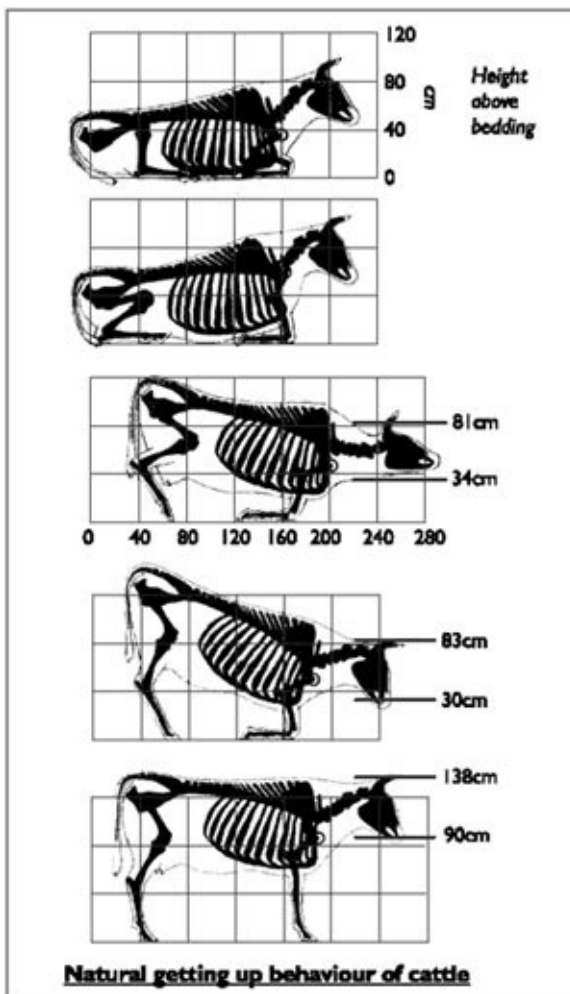
Cubicle

## What and how of the Release cubicles

The Release cubicles are developed for cows standing up and laying down just like they do in pastures. Ofcourse it is important to know how cows stand up and lay down.



This picture is made in 1969. On this picture you can see how a cow stands up. The cow in this picture is not limited by cubicles.

It is obvious that the cow needs a length of approximately 280 cm. to stand up. Modern-day cows are a little bit bigger then the height of 138 cm. They will be about 150 cm. You can say that modern-day cows need about 290 to 300 cm. to stand up.

The Release Concept has no barriers in front of the bedding, so the cow is not limited by standing up. By the adjustable tree withers has the cow full freedom by standing up.

The flexible tubes are working like guides and do not hurt the cows when they want to lay down or stand up.
